ACCELERATOR PRODUCED RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL: DRAFT LEGISLATIVE BILL AND SECTION ANALYSIS (STP-02-056)

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is seeking an amendment to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 that will extend the Commission's regulatory authority to accelerator-produced radioactive (ARM) material. The Commission is of the view that this will provide regulatory consistency and predictability for users of ARM material, and will lead to greater public assurance that such material is used and controlled in a manner that maintains public health and safety.

The Draft Legislative Bill and Section Analysis have been uploaded to the NRC's Technical Conference Forum (TCF) under a subsystem where access is limited to Agreement States.
