OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON DRAFT INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGENCY (IAEA) SAFETY GUIDE "DS356: NEAR SURFACE DISPOSAL OF RADIOACTIVE WASTE" (FSME-10- 005)

Purpose: To provide an opportunity to comment on the draft IAEA safety guide "DS356: Near Surface Disposal of Radioactive Waste".

Background: The proposed IAEA Safety Guide is intended to provide guidance to international users on the disposal of a wide range of radioactive waste appropriate for near surface disposal. The guidance is provided for information, in consideration of IAEA methodology and approach. It may be considered by certain international users as a point of reference among other consensus and international guides. IAEA recommends that this guidance, when used, be applied in accordance with the graded approach, consistent with the intrinsic hazard presented by the waste to be disposed.

Comments are requested in relation to:

- 1) Relevance and usefulness: are the stated safety objectives of the standard appropriate, and are they met by the document?
- 2) Scope and completeness: is the stated scope appropriate and is that scope adequately covered by the document?
- 3) Quality and clarity: do the requirements/guidance in the document represent the current consensus among specialists in the field, and are they expressed clearly and coherently?

Discussion: The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is seeking comment on the proposed changes to IAEA Safety Guide DS 356 "Near Surface Disposal of Radioactive Waste". Comments from the United States, and other Member States and International Organizations will be considered by the IAEA.
