COURSE: Students will be expected to be present at the beginning of the workshop on Monday, April 24, 2006 at 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The workshop will end at 12:00 noon on Friday, April 28, 2006. Students will be required to complete casework assignments by working together with other students after class hours.

Also, on two days during the workshop, there will be site tours to local source vendors. In order to organize travel, please let the contact person listed in this letter know if you will not have your own transportation. The host and NRC will ensure that everyone has a transportation.

LODGING & TRAVEL:

NOTE: It is very important that all attending stay in the Marriott - Atlanta Perimeter Center. The arrangements made between the NRC and the hotel are such that we must have at least 18 rooms rented for this event in order to avoid room attrition costs as part of the meeting room contract.
