**COURSE:** The course will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, September 8, 2010, and end at 4:00 p.m. each day, except Friday, September 10, 2010. The September 10 course will end at 12:00 noon. Participants must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. Cellular phones and similar devices with audible capability should be disabled while classes are in session. Normal office/business attire is appropriate for students attending Technical Training Center courses.
