INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

ACCEPTANCE: This is to advise you that those individuals in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the training course H-401, "Nuclear Pharmacy Course." This course is scheduled to be presented September 21-23, 2010 at the Hilton Orlando/Altamonte Springs Hotel located 350 S. North Lake Boulevard, Altamonte Springs, Florida 32701. If you have any questions regarding the logistics of the course you can contact Debbie Gilley at 850-245-4266.

COURSE: The course will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 21, 2010, and end at 4:00 p.m. each day, with the exception of Thursday, September 23, 2010. Thursday's course will end at 12:00 noon. Participants must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. Cellular phones and similar devices with audible capability should be disabled while classes are in session. Normal office/business attire is appropriate for students attending Technical Training Center courses. Please complete the Travel Application Form located at <http://nrc-stp.ornl.gov/training.html> and return it to Brenda Usilton at Brenda.Usilton@nrc.gov or fax it to 301-415-3502. If you have any questions regarding the travel form please contact Brenda on 301-415-2348. No rental cars will be authorized for travel. You will need to take a taxi or shuttle to and from the airport. You will also go to the same website to receive a copy of the travel instructions and voucher for reimbursement.

LODGING: You should plan to arrive on Monday, September 20, 2010, and depart on Thursday, September 23, 2010. Individuals should request a government rate at the hotel. The per diem for the Altamonte Springs area is 93/61/154. This means lodging/meals/not to exceed total per day. Florida has made arrangements with the Hilton Orlando/Altamonte Springs Hotel and received a special group rate of \$89.00 per night plus a complimentary breakfast. The per diem for your meals will be reduced by \$10.00 each day for your breakfast. To reserve your room at the special rate, contact the hotel at 407-830-1985 and reference the "Bureau of Radiation Control-FDOH." The hotel has a shuttle that will take you to the mall and local restaurants (3 mile radius) and pick you up.
