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INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

<u>ACCEPTANCE:</u> This is to advise you that those individuals in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the training course (H-313) Brachytherapy & Gamma Knife. This course is scheduled to be presented June 17-21, 2013, at the Advanced Health Education Center (AHEC) located at 8502 Tybor Drive, Houston, Texas 77074.

<u>COURSE:</u> This course will be conducted beginning at 8:00 a.m. and end at 5:00 p.m. each day except for Friday, June 21, 2013, which is scheduled to end at 1:00 pm. The classrooms are located on the 2nd floor, if you have special needs please notify us so that we may provide that information to the contractor. A tentative outline for the course (Enclosure 3) is attached. There are multiple eating facilities within walking distance. AHEC will accept food deliveries located at the facilities lunch area.

LODGING AND TRAVEL: You should plan to arrive on Sunday, June 16, 2013, and depart on Friday, June 21, 2013. Participants must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. Individuals should request a government rate at the hotels. No rental cars will be authorized for travel. If traveling by air, you need to contact Carlson Travel at 1-866-250-2160 for airline reservations. Please view the list of hotels that are located near the training facility in Houston, TX. Individuals should request a Federal Government employee rate at the hotels. The per diem for Houston, TX area is 109/71/180. This means lodging/meals/not to exceed total. Tax should be exempt for this area.
