INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

<u>ACCEPTANCE</u>: This is to advise you that those individuals in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the Training Course (H-314), Safety Aspects of Well Logging. This course is scheduled to be presented September 22 - 26, 2014, at Schlumberger Technology Corporation's training facility, 210 Schlumberger Drive, Sugar Land, Texas, a Houston suburb.

<u>COURSE</u>: The course starts at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, September 22, 2014, and 8:00 a.m. Tuesday through Friday. The daily sessions will end at approximately 5:00 p.m. each day with the exception of Friday, September 26, when it will end at noon. LODGING AND TRAVEL: Please plan to arrive on Sunday, September 21, 2014, and depart on Friday, September 26, 2014. Students must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. If traveling by air, please contact Carlson Travel at 1-800-453-8396 for airline reservations, and indicate that the travel is "Invitational/ACRS" for the NRC. Students should complete the new Travel Application Form which is located at http://nrc-stp.ornl.gov/training.html and return to Marcia Casby (AStrainingandtravel.Resource@nrc.gov) by Monday, August 11. If you have any questions regarding the travel form please contact Marcia Casby at 301-4156525. Individuals should request the Federal government rate at the hotels. The per diem for Houston, Texas is 118/71/189. This means that lodging/meals/not to exceed the total. No rental cars will be authorized for travel. Students will be reimbursed for transportation between the airport and hotel, and between the hotel and the training center. If you plan to drive, the Federal mileage reimbursement is 56 cents per mile. Students staying at the same hotel are encouraged to coordinate with each other to arrange transportation between the hotel and the training center. Houston, Texas is a tax exempt city and we, therefore, request that you complete and provide the tax exempt form to the hotel upon check in.

Lodging arrangements have been made with the Sugar Land Marriott Town Square, 16090 City Walk, Sugar Land, Texas 77479. The block of rooms at the Sugar Land Marriott Town Square is under the group "TDSHS - NRC WELL LOGGING." DIRECTIONS TO THE SCHLUMBERGER TECHNOLOGY CORPORATION TRAINING

FACILITY: From Houston Intercontinental Airport

Take Beltway 8 from Houston Intercontinental Airport west then south to the U.S. Highway 59 South exit (approximately 40 miles). Go south on U.S. 59 for 3.2 miles to the Alt. 90/Spur 41 Sugarland Exit. Turn right on Spur 41 (Dairy Ashford) and go to the stop light. Turn left on 90A (stay in right land of 90A). Turn right onto Schlumberger Drive. Follow signs to visitor's center parking area. Check-in at visitor's reception in the Forum Building just off visitors parking area.

From Houston Hobby Airport
