ACCEPTANCE: Individuals listed in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the Materials Control, Security Systems & Principles (S-201) course. This course is scheduled to be presented August 14-18, 2017, at the Sandia National Labs (SNL) in Albuquerque, NM, located on Kirtland Air Force Base. Please contact Marcia Casby at (301) 415-6525 immediately if you are unable to attend this course.

<u>COURSE</u>: Please see our Web site, <u>https://scp.nrc.gov/training.html</u> for the Tentative Course Schedule and note that the course begins at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, August 14, 2017, and ends at 12 noon on Friday, August 18, 2017.

LODGING AND TRAVEL: Please plan to arrive on Sunday, August 13, 2017, and depart on Friday, August 18, 2017. Students must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. If traveling by air, please contact El Sol Travel at 844-244-6694 for airline reservations, and indicate that the travel is "Invitational" for the NRC. Please select a fully refundable government fare if one is available and make sure that El Sol Travel correctly direct bills your flight to credit card ending 2835. Flights may be converted to less costly, non-refundable tickets, so please select carefully. If the need arises and you must make a change, contact Marcia Casby at (301) 415-6525.

Please complete the Travel Application Form which will be provided to you and submit to Marcia Casby, <u>AStrainingandtravel.Resource@nrc.gov</u>, at your earliest opportunity, but no later than Friday, June 23rd. Individuals should request the Federal government rate at the hotels. The per diem for Albuquerque, New Mexico is \$91 hotel and \$51 meals and incidentals. If you are authorized to drive, the Federal mileage reimbursement is 53.5 cents per mile. Hotel information and additional guidance will be provided in the "Welcome Letter" which will be emailed to each attendee. It is important that the information provided in the "Welcome Letter" be reviewed thoroughly and the required forms are submitted by the stated deadline.

DIRECT DEPOSIT: We recommend Direct Deposit for travel reimbursements. If you prefer this method, please complete the Direct Deposit Authorization form located on our website and follow the directions on the form to submit. Once you have signed up for Direct Deposit, you are in the system and will not need to complete a new form unless your banking information changes.
